

SIGNS YOUR PET NEEDS TO SEE THE VET

- Continued Vomiting
- ODiarrhea not responding to fasting or bland diet
- Unintended weight loss
- Change in appetite—decreased or increased
- Ohange in normal activity level: lethargy, hyperactivity, or restlessness
- Limping
- Sudden inability to move back legs
- Crying in pain when touched
- Clumsy or disoriented behavior
- Seizures
- Any loss of consciousness
- Coughing, especially at night
- Panting in a cat
- Any difficulty breathing or labored breathing
- O Any blue, purple, or pale hue to the tongue and gums
- Sudden collapse
- Excessive drooling
- OStraining in the litter box without producing any urine
- Crying out while urinating
- Ochange in urination: location, frequency, amount, color, smell
- Bloated abdomen
- Sneezing excessively
- Uncontrolled bleeding
- Nose-bleed or bruising anywhere on body
- Any unusual odor
- Hair loss
- ORunny eyes or nose
- Squinting
